**World Heritage Nirayama Reverberatory Furnace**



In July 2015 the "Sites of Japan's Meiji Industrial Revolution" including the Nirayama Reverberatory Furnace, was registered as a World Heritage site. Egawa Tarozaemon, governor of Nirayama at the end of the Shogunate, built the furnace to produce cannons.

This cable car carries passengers to the summit of Mt. Nesugata and back. Mt. Nesugata is renowned for its superb view and marriage. At the top is a temple whose principal object of Buddhist worship, the Ragaraja, is widely believed to intercede in issues of importance to women, such as respect and affection, marriage and children.

**Ryugukutsu Cave**



Ryugukutsu Cave is a sea cave whose ceiling is partially collapsed, creating a skylight some 50m wide. Cave skylights such as these are not uncommon in Japan, but the Ryugukutsu skylight is one of the nation's largest.

**IZU CHOHACHI ART MUSEUM**



Here you will see an exhibit of 40 works by Matsuzaki town native Chohachi Irie, master of the shikkukote-e ("plaster and trowel") style of picture-painting. As the name suggests, this style involves the creation of a bas-relief painting using only plaster, pigments and a trowel. The technique is highly praised in artistic circles as a distinctive mural technique that compares favorably with Western fresco art.





### Mt. Omuro

Mt. Omuro is a cinder cone (extinct volcano) with an elevation of 580m and a crater 300m in diameter. A ride by chair lift to the summit rewards you with an unforgettable 360-degree panoramic view that takes in the Amagi Range, Mt. Fuji, Mt. Hakone and other peaks.

Atagawa is sacred ground. Years ago Benzaiten, the Buddhist goddess of music, appeared in a dream to an ancestor of the land owner and told him that if he dug here he would find an abundance of hot springs. The goddess was true to her words: The ancestor dug and found hot spring water which was at 100 degrees. It is said that if you pour hot water over her she will grant you a wish.

Inatori Kinme is a breed of kinme-dai (splendid alfonsino fish) that is highly prized in the Japanese market. When fresh, its fatty texture is perfect for nitsuke (fish boiled in soy sauce). It is widely served in the inns, hotels and restaurants of Higashi-Izu town.

### Inatori Hosono Plateau

At the base of Mt. Misuji in the Izuamagi Range, a 125ha grassland spreads out, overlooking the sea of Sagami and Izu Shichitou. It is thick with Japanese pampas grass in the fall and ripe for picking mountain vegetables in the spring, making this plateau an ideal hiking area.


# Map of entire IZU Area



## Recommended Sightseeing Spots



**Izu Shaboten Zoo**  
In winter the highly popular capybaras can be seen diving into the open-air bath. The animals are adorable and the sight of them having fun playing is soothing to the soul.



**Izu Cruise**  
The Port of Shimoda is the site where the "Kurofune" (black ships) from America opened Japan's ports at the end of the Shogunate period. You can tour this port in the Susquehanna, a mockup of one of the black ships. Tour sites such as the spot where Commodore Perry dropped anchor.



**Cape Koibitomisaki**  
It is said that ringing the bell three times at Cape Koibitomisaki (the name means "Lover's Point") assures one of finding one's true love. You'll fall in love with the view of Mt. Fuji as well.



**Kumomi coast**  
The unobstructed view of Mt. Fuji on a clear day makes this a beach of spectacular scenery. It's also a celebrated spot for diving.



**Kamo wind chimes** (Koganezaki Crystal Park)  
These wind chimes have a special significance as they are made in the "hometown of glass," where the raw materials for glassmaking have been extracted for generations. The wind chimes of this area are known for their distinctive designs and clear, strong resonance.



**Cape Mihamamisaki**  
This scenic spot has flowers in bloom all year round, with such varying flora as cherry trees, big-leaf hydrangea, Thunberg lilies, crinums and Japanese silverleaf. The natural beauty of the sea, the pine forest and Mt. Fuji combine with a beauty that heals the soul.



**Kurone Rock Bath**  
The closer the open-air bath is to the sea, the greater the spray from the ocean is. The vast blue horizon creates an incredible sense of openness.



**iZoo (animal experience zoo)**  
This zoo is one of Japan's largest playgrounds for reptiles and amphibians. Visitors can encounter snakes, lizards, crocodiles, turtles and more, from all over the world.



**Cape Koibitomisaki**  
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**"Mt. Katsuragi, Izunokuni Panorama Park"**  
The summit of Mt. Katsugi is just 7 minutes away by cable car. From the summit 452m above sea level, the view of Mt. Fuji is unforgettable.



**Koganezaki**  
Koganezaki, "Golden Ridge," gets its name from the golden cast of the rocks when the last rays of the sun splash over them. This spot affords breathtaking views of both Suruga Bay and Mt. Fuji.




**Port of Numazu**  
This seaside town brims with restaurants serving fresh fish landed at the Port of Numazu and charming souvenir shops selling dried delicacies. A deep-sea aquarium and an observation deck on a flood gate provide additional entertainment.



**Joren Waterfall**  
The largest of the falls at Mt. Amagi, this waterfall is 25m high, 7m wide and has a plunge basin 15m deep. Restaurants and souvenir shops are also here to serve you.



**Shimoda Park Hydrangea Festival**  
Shimoda Park lies on a modest elevation overlooking the Port of Shimoda. Here, on a 330,000sqm site, some 150,000 big-leaf hydrangeas are thickly planted, sporting some 3 million flowers.



**Yumigahama Beach**  
The shore extends for 1km at Yumigahama. The expanse of blue sky and white sand on this beach at the southernmost tip of Minamizu wins Yumigahama a listing in Japan's "100 best beaches."



**Irozaki**  
From this point at the southernmost tip of the Izu Peninsula, you can look out at the horizon and confirm that the earth is round. The medium-sized lighthouse, reminiscent of a tower of chalk, gains entry in its own list, the list of "Japan's 50 most beloved lighthouses."



**Genbe River**  
Even today, visitors to Mishima, the "city of water," can see springs all over town where fresh, clear water from the slopes of Mt. Fuji gush forth, as they stroll along the walking path on the riverside.

## Izu Event Guide



**Hina no Turushi Kazari Festival**  
At the Girls' Festival of Inatori Onsen, it has been a tradition since the late Edo (Shogunate) period to wear tsurushi kazari. These decorations are fashioned by mothers and grandmothers in prayer that their daughters will grow up healthy and strong.  
● Event locations: Higashi Izu Town  
● Period: January 20 to March 31



**Kawazu Cherry Blossom Festival**  
Kawazu cherry trees are distinctive for their large, pink blossoms. Each year, the cherries bloom for a full month, beginning in early February, attracting numerous hanami (cherry-blossom viewing) tourists.  
● Event locations: Kawazu Town  
● Period: February 10 to March 10



**Izu Kogen Cherry Blossom Festival**  
Izu Kogen is famed throughout Japan for its gaudy stands of blooming cherry trees. Cherry trees line the streets for 3km from the train station, enfolding the visitor in unforgettable scenery.  
● Event locations: Ito City  
● Period: Late March to early April



**Shimoda Park Hydrangea Festival**  
Shimoda Park lies on a modest elevation overlooking the Port of Shimoda. Here, on a 330,000sqm site, some 150,000 big-leaf hydrangeas are thickly planted, sporting some 3 million flowers.  
● Event locations: Shimoda City  
● Period: June 1 to 30




**Iseebi Spiny Lobster Festival**  
Minami Izu town boasts one of the largest catches of Iseebi spiny lobster of any town in Japan. From the time the ban on Iseebi spiny lobster fishing is lifted to November 30, guests staying in the town can enjoy delicious preparations of Iseebi spiny lobster in Minami Izu's Iseebi Spiny Lobster Festival.  
● Event locations: Minami Izu Town  
● Period: September 20 to November 30



**Opening of the evening observation deck**  
From fall to winter, the majestic sunsets over the Otago coast attracts crowds of tourists and photography buffs. "Sunset volunteers" offer visitors information and wisdom on the uniqueness of the sunset in Otago.  
● Event locations: Nishizu Town  
● Period: Approx. 1 month around March and September



**Orange picking**  
On the east coast of Izu, surrounded by mild climate, many orange gardens spread. Various kinds of oranges are produced, and varieties that can be harvested are different depending on time.  
● Event locations: Ito city  
● Period: October to June



**Strawberry picking**  
Every year during this period this park becomes crowded with visitors. The fresh, sweet strawberries grown here, nourished by the famous waters of the foothills of Mt. Fuji, must be tasted to be believed.  
● Event locations: Izunokuni City  
● Period: Mid-December to mid-May
